# Restorative Practice Policy

#### What is RP?

Restorative Practice is based on the principles of Fairness, Inclusion, Engagement, Accountability and Collaboration. It is a reactive response to wrong-doing. It focuses on the explicit promotion and enhancement of particular skills such as empathy and problem solving. It allows for building trust between and with people. It provides a structured approach to maintain and sustain positive relationships and to prevent escalation of further conflict. Blame and Shame have no part in RP. It humanises rather than demonises the person.

#### **Restorative Circles**

To participate in a circle gives a sense of belonging. In the circle, everyone can see everyone else and takes turns in speaking, and what everyone says, everyone can hear. To meet and communicate in a circle increases the possibility for positive, safe relationships and a psychosocial atmosphere best described as a collective attention - a sense of 'we'. (Using Restorative Circles in Schools (Berit Follestad and Nina Wroldsen)

#### **Types of Circles**

- 1. Go- Around: In sequence, high participation, general topics, responding to prompts, introductions.
- 2. Popcorn Circle: Less structured, no particular order, participation encouraged but not mandatory, choice to speak.
- 3. Highly Structured: Formal, tightly facilitated and problem solving

#### **Restorative Practice Questions**

- What happened?
- What were you thinking of at the time?
- What have you thought about it since?
- Who has been affected and in what way?
- How could things have been done differently?
- What do you think needs to happen next?
